

English

In English this half term, Students explore the enchanting narratives of "The Lancashire Giant," "The Man in the Tin Forest," and "The Lady in a Vinegar Bottle." Through these stories, learners are encouraged to analyse themes, characters, and settings, fostering critical thinking and creativity. Pupils apply their understanding by writing their own folk tales, thus enhancing their narrative skills and appreciation for storytelling traditions.

Mathematics

This half term we will be exploring number and place value: we will learn to count in multiples of 6, 7, 9, 25 and 1000 whilst continuing to build on the times tables we have learnt previously. We will be recognising the value digits in numbers with up to 4 digits and order and compare these numbers. We will also be learning to add and subtract numbers with up to 4 digits.

Science

A key focus is the exploration of fossils. Additionally, students examine the significance of soil, recognising its vital role ecological balance. Through hands-on activities and collaborative projects, pupils develop critical thinking.

Outdoor Learning inc. Forest School & Visits

This terms outdoor learning will focus on safe boundaries when in the forest and will also have cross curricular links with our thrive approach action plans.

PSHRE

We will be focussing on 'Being Me In My World.' This will include work centred around feeling special and safe, being part of a class, rights and responsibilities, rewards and feeling proud.

PE & Physical Activity

'Multi-Skills' is our unit focussing on movement, thinking and communicating skills. Some of the skills include: catching, throwing, travelling and stability.

Humanities - Our thematic approach of "No Place Like Home," students explored the rich history and diverse geographical features of Lancashire. This inquiry-based learning fostered a deep appreciation for the region's heritage, from its industrial past to its scenic landscapes.

Other Curriculum Areas

These subjects will centre around and embed learning within our 'Our World' topic.

Computing

Programming - students have utilised Purple Mash to create engaging presentations, enhancing their digital literacy and communication skills. By exploring various multimedia tools, they demonstrated creativity and organisation, effectively conveying their ideas. This activity has fostered collaboration and improved their ability to present information confidently to peers

RE

Islam - we will explore the significance of prayer (Salah) for Muslims. Prayer is a fundamental aspect of their faith, fostering a direct connection with Allah. It encourages discipline, mindfulness, and community cohesion, as Muslims are required to pray five times a day, reinforcing their beliefs and values.
