

English –

Roses will engage with identifying key elements of fables, such as the setting, characters, and plot structure. Pupils will engage in reading a variety of fables from different cultures, analysing the morals presented and discussing their relevance to contemporary life. Additionally, students will be encouraged to create their own fables, fostering creativity and enhancing their understanding of narrative construction.

Mathematics

This half term Roses will concentrate on multiplication and division, aiming to solidify students' understanding of these fundamental concepts. Pupils will learn to recognise and use multiplication and division facts up to 12 times 12, employing various strategies such as repeated addition and arrays. Practical activities will be integrated to enhance comprehension.

Science. Roses will study the human skeleton, focusing on its structure and function. The curriculum will cover the names and functions of major bones, the role of the skeleton in protecting vital organs, and the importance of a healthy lifestyle for maintaining bone strength

Outdoor Learning inc.

This terms outdoor learning will have a thematic approach leaning towards art projects and gearing up to a busy spring period in the polytunnel

PSHRE - Celebrating difference through the Jigsaw approach. This unit encourages children to explore diversity, fostering respect and understanding among peers. Activities will promote empathy, acceptance, and recognition of unique qualities.

PE & Physical Activity Roses will receive coaching in cricket led by the Lancashire Cricket Club. The curriculum will focus on developing fundamental cricket skills, including batting, bowling and fielding.

Humanities - "Food Around the World" will provide an interdisciplinary approach, integrating elements from geography, history, and cultural studies. will investigate the diverse culinary traditions of various countries, learning about the ingredients, cooking methods, and cultural significance.

Other Curriculum Areas

These subjects will centre around and embed learning within our 'Our World' topic.

Computing

Typing will introduce students to touch typing, an essential skill for effective digital communication. pupils will learn the correct finger placement on the keyboard and practice typing without looking at the keys. The curriculum will include interactive typing games and exercises designed to improve speed and accuracy

Christianity - Students will explore the theme of miracles within Christianity. The curriculum will involve studying key biblical miracles, such as the healing of the sick and the feeding of the 5,000. Pupils will engage in discussions about the significance of these miracles and their impact on the lives of believers. Additionally, students will reflect on the concept of faith and how miracles can inspire hope and compassion in everyday life.

MFL

Spanish - will focus on vocabulary related to foods. Students will learn to identify and name various fruits, vegetables, and traditional dishes in Spanish, enhancing their linguistic skills and cultural awareness. Interactive activities, such as role-playing in a restaurant setting and creating a food diary, will be employed to reinforce vocabulary acquisition
